Work Tasks Include

- Participates in pre-suppression activities including hazardous reduction/weed abatement inspections and fire hazard reduction defensible space work on public and private property.
- Provide home hardening, defensible space fire prevention, and fire hazard reduction information to the public, department personnel, and other agencies.
- Recommends when an abatement notice on a property should be served and notifies property owner(s) or occupant(s).
- Explains Berkeley’s abatement program regulations, costs and procedures to property owners.
- Support citywide response as disaster service worker.
- Collects, enters, maintains, and disseminates data pertaining to wildfire prevention; reconciles reports, files, and records.
- Composes letters and reports based on field notes along with utilizing electronic devices to input and collect data.
